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
# **Call to Pray for Peace**

Almost 175 years ago, Blessed Basile Moreau, the Founder of the Congregation of Holy Cross, who suffered through the aftermath of the French Revolution, wrote in a letter to his religious, "Let us unite and pray fervently to obtain of Jesus Christ through Mary that God may deign to shorten the time of trial we are especially facing now."

As the global Family of Holy Cross, we unite our hearts and prayers, in the spirit of Father Moreau, so that God may shorten this time of trial, violence and war in our world, for as Venerable Patrick Peyton said, "A world at prayer is a world at peace."

In our prayer, we turn to our Holy Cross Patroness, Our Lady of Sorrows, to seek her intercession to ensure a future of peace. Mary knew intimately both sorrow and suffering in her life. As the Mother of us all, she suffers with us, especially, with those victims of war and violence.

Through her intercession, as we reflect on the sorrows of our war-torn world, we hope that Mary will be Our Lady of Hope, helping us to be peacemakers, men, and women with hope to bring in our world today, so that there may be an end to all violence and war.

# **Holy Cross and Devotion to Our Lady of Sorrows**

Devotion to Our Lady of Sorrows extends back at least to the 13th century and was fostered by the Servites in Italy. Originally, more than seven sorrows were part of the devotion, but eventually the seven recognized today were settled upon. In 1814, Pope Pius VII established the Friday before Holy Week as the Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows for the Universal Church. Early in the 20th century, Pope Pius X designated September 15 as the memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows.

The neighborhood of Saint Croix, just outside of Le Mans, where Blessed Basile Moreau founded the Congregation of Holy Cross in the 1830s, had long been dedicated to Mary under the title of Notre Dame de Sainte Croix. Usually, Notre Dame de Sainte Croix was depicted in the Pietà, and so she was also understood to be Mary of the Seven Sorrows as the Pietà represented all her seven sorrows.

It is not known precisely when Blessed Basile Moreau became familiar with the rosary of Our Lady of Sorrows, though his devotion to Mary was nurtured by his mother. His attraction to Our Lady of Sorrows was rooted in her close association with the passion and death of Jesus.

The 1920 General Chapter of the Congregation of Holy Cross designated Our Lady of Sorrows as the Congregation's patroness.

In the words of the current *Constitutions* of Holy Cross: "There stood by the cross of Jesus his mother Mary, who knew grief and was a Lady of Sorrows. She is our special patroness, a woman who bore much she could not understand and who stood fast. To her many sons and daughters, whose devotions ought to bring them often to her side, she tells much of this daily cross and its daily hope" (8:120).

# **How to Pray the Seven Sorrows of Mary Rosary**

# **Introductory Prayers**

### **Sign of the Cross**

In the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Amen.

#### **Opening Prayer**

The following is the traditional opening prayer, which has been changed for the Global Rosary for World Peace Prayer Event.

My God, I offer You this Rosary for Your glory, so I can honor Your Holy Mother, the Blessed Virgin, so I can share and meditate upon her suffering. I humbly beg You to give me true repentance for all my sins. Give me wisdom and humility, so that I may receive all the indulgences contained in this prayer.

#### **Act of Contrition**

O my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended You, and I detest all my sins because I dread the loss of Heaven and the pains of Hell; but most of all because they offend You, my God. You Who are all good and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve, with the help of Your grace, to confess my sins, to do penance, and to amend my life. Amen.

### **Three Hail Mary's**

Hail, Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou amongst women and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

#### Response

Most Merciful Mother, remind us always about the Sorrows of your Son, Jesus.

## Seven Sorrows of Mary

- 1. The Presentation of Jesus in the Temple (Luke 2:34-35)
- 2. The Flight into Egypt with Jesus (Matthew 2:13-14)
- 3. The Loss of the Child Jesus (Luke 2:43-45)
- 4. The Encounter with Jesus on the Way to Calvary (Luke 23:27-29)
- 5. The Crucifixion of Jesus (John 19:25-30)
- 6. The Cradling of Jesus' Body in Her Arms (John 19:32-34)
- 7. The Laying of Jesus in the Tomb (John 19:41-42)

For each of the seven sorrows, the following prayers are said. The Scripture passages can also be read at the beginning of the sorrow, and in some versions, there is a particular prayer to conclude each sorrow.

#### **One Our Father**

Our Father, who art in heaven, hollowed be Thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

#### Three Hail Mary's

Hail, Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou amongst women and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

#### Response

Most Merciful Mother, remind us always about the Sorrows of your Son, Jesus.

## **Closing Prayers**

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The following is the traditional closing prayer, which has been changed for the Global Rosary for World Peace Prayer Event.

Queen of Martyrs, your heart suffered so much. I beg you, by the merits of the tears you shed in these terrible and sorrowful times, to obtain for me and all the sinners of the world the grace of complete sincerity and repentance. Amen.

#### Response

Mary, who was conceived without sin and who suffered for us, pray for us. (3x)

#### **Sign of the Cross**

In the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Ghana, Brazil & Peru



### "A World at Prayer is a World at Peace"


Venerable Patrick Peyton
